Letter From The President

Hello, Friends.

Spring is well upon us with Summer right around the corner. Yay, no more cold weather \sim Boo, flies are out! But who doesn't love the longer days when we have time to get more done? Good thing as it seems there is more to do and I am sure we are all filling our days, weeks, even months ahead with plans and events. Let's go!

It seems lately I've been explaining how to do things a lot lately. Whether it is new barn help (how to feed, turn out, clean up), farm help (how to mow, trim, pick up poop), a new aspect of riding to a student, and especially new and more complicated test movements to my own Danny. At times this feels daunting, explaining a big task to anyone, and in particular to our beloved horses, who don't share our language, or certainly not our vision of the future performance goals. Have you ever stopped to think how senseless some of our requests must seem to the horses? Go sideways, now straight, now make a flying change in the corner, go here, do something else that makes no sense in terms of balance, and then change gaits all of a sudden. What???

I'm sure many of you have been asked by people unfamiliar with horses, "how do you get them to do all that?" Great question, and one any of us who have started young 3 year olds who can barely stagger around the arena following an open rein fully understand!

How DO we get them from that stage to where they are doing the complicated, advanced and highly balanced movements of the upper levels and even FEI? One baby step at a time.

I worked for many years with a wonderful trainer from Germany, Melissa Simms, who had an uncanny patience with horses (more so than with the riders she had to teach!) and she would say: if you can't get it in canter,



Show season is now underway, for both Recognized and Schooling shows! Remember that if you want to be sure to be eligible for Year-End Awards, your horse must be registered with ODS! USDF "L" Program Update

The ODS "L" Candidates have a little breather until June 17-18 when they will reconvene again in Iowa for the D Session of Part 2. This is a very time consuming endeavor for them, because in addition to the training sessions, they also must accrue a certain number of hours of scribing, as well as sitting with a willing "S" Judge and cooperative show management at a Recognized Show. And it is not just sitting; they must observe 20 rides at each level of Training, First, and Second level, plus be expected to make comments! Talk about experience and great training!

do it in trot; if you can't get it in trot, come to walk; if you can't get it in walk, halt. Halt? Yes \sim sit still and *feel* in your own body what you have to do to communicate with your horse.

I literally just went through this with Danny, broke down part of the canter tour into little bits he could do successfully. Can you go sideways in walk? Yes. Can you go sideways in trot? Yes. How about canter? Yes, if I can practice a couple of times. Now how about straight after the sideways? When he could answer 'yes' to everything, the whole movement became

smoother, whereas when I tried to present it as a whole it fell apart. Slow down, take time to patiently explain it in pieces to your audience (your horse, spouse, kids, employee) in ways they can comprehend. Then we ALL get to feel successful ~ and isn't that what we are all after!

Now, I'm off for a ride ~ hope your rides are successful!

Janet Foy Spring Symposium Reflections & Lessons

Every year my students and I look forward to the ODS Spring Symposium. Every year the club brings in one of the top notch people in Dressage to Oklahoma!

This year they invited 5* Olympic Judge, author and clinician Janet Foy. The focus was the new 2023 Dressage Tests plus pointers on Musical Freestyles from a judge's point of view.

My ride this year was my client Shiela Reynolds' PRE gelding "Legendario" aka "Rio." I was to demonstrate 3rd level #1 and #2.

"Rio" is an absolute delight to have in our stable. When we got him, he could do some very quick moves... spins and go the other way! Teaching him to stretch over the back into an elastic contact has been our main focus. He has really blossomed in his training and we were so proud of the confidence he had in himself at his first clinic and public appearance.

Janet's main focus was his walk pirouettes. Rio is a quick thinker and a mind reader so he takes over in the turns. In his mind, faster is better! Janet had several approaches. On Saturday, she had me go up and down the centerline and use 1/2 steps before the turn to make him sit more. On Sunday, we focused on firm outside rein half halts to help him wait for the turns and to turn as slow as possible. Janet also gave me tips for the show ring to help me make him wait for the flying changes.

Not knowing what to expect, as Janet just came from judging the World Cup in Omaha, she treated every horse and rider combination with the same enthusiasm. She was candid, honest and helped each pair improve on common problems as well as involving the auditors in the process. The club had a great variety of horse and rider combinations to learn from.

I had the pleasure of driving Janet to the airport on Sunday. We talked about her Ballroom Dancing and I learned that she is quite the cook as she went to

the Cordon Bleu in England! While she was in England, she started her formal Dressage training. We chatted about my time with Alf and my training on his Lipizzaner Stallions and I learned that her Grandfather was Austrian. He was enamored with the Spanish Riding School and it was him that drove Janet and her sister every Saturday morning to their riding lesson in Colorado Springs. Her Grandfather was her great support.

A big thank you to ODS for another great symposium, Southern Hills Riding Academy for hosting, the volunteers that make this happen and Pamela Buyers for her great organization!

Regular Schooling Show Rules

Multiple riders permitted to show one horse, but not to exceed a total of 4 tests/5 classes per horse per day. Horse can be ridden in 2 consecutive levels.

- Entry fees must be paid in full prior to releasing show packets. Entries need to be received by the Wednesday before the show (payment due at packet pick-up)
- *No phone, or fax entries will be accepted.

All riders MUST wear approved ASTM/SEI helmets while mounted. Boots with a heel, shirt/jacket with collar and sleeves are required. Western Dressage riders must wear show attire, chaps optional.

- USEF/USDF Rules will be observed. Refer to www.USDF.org and www.USEF.org.
- USDF 2023 Dressage Tests used. Refer to www.USDF.org.
- Western Dressage Tests can be found at www.westerndressageassociation.org.
- Prix Caprilli tests are available on the ODS website

DIVISIONS:

- JR/YR—Junior/Young Rider, 21 years and younger by Dec. 1 of the membership year, non-professional
- AA—Adult Amateur, 22 years of age and older by Dec. 1 of the membership year, nonprofessional
- Open—Any age, professional

- All divisions will ride together but be pinned separately.
- High point awards will be presented for each level and division. •
- Current (12 month) negative Coggins is required for all horses brought onto grounds

Oklahoma Dressage Society Education Scholarship Information & Application

The ODS Education Scholarship provides financial assistance to Oklahoma Dressage members to further their dressage education.



Criteria for Eligibility:

- 1. This ODS Education Scholarship is open to all Oklahoma Dressage Society Members: juniors, adults, or vintage riders, amateurs or professionals, including ODS member volunteers and committee members.
- 2. The candidate must be a current member in good standing of Oklahoma Dressage Society (ODS). In addition, the applicant must have been an ODS member for at least the 2 previous years.
- 3. The candidate must have a background of attending previous ODS dressage educational events. The more ODS event attendance, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Attendance at non-ODS dressage educational events will be considered as additional input.
- 4. The candidate must have a background of volunteerism for ODS. This includes volunteering on at least one (1) ODS committee or have accumulated five (5) hours of volunteering at ODS events. The more ODS volunteerism, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Volunteerism for non-ODS dressage related events will be considered as additional input.

Criteria for Use:

Scholarships may be used toward the registration/entry fees for the following types of dressage educational events:

- Acceptable activities will include ODS and its affiliated chapters educational events, USDF Region 9 and USDF educational events. Additionally, any educational event or clinic given by a USDF/USEF judge, USDF/USEF technical delegate, USDF Certified Instructor, USDF "L" Program graduate, or USDF Medalist.
- 2. Scholarship candidates must receive ODS Scholarship Committee approval for the use of this scholarship at a specific dressage educational event <u>prior</u> to the event occurring.

The ODS Scholarship Committee will review applications for funds and make recommendations to the Board for their vote. The Governing Board will select members to sit on this committee for a period of one year.

Application Deadline:

The ODS Education Scholarship committee will meet a minimum of two times per year. Each scholarship application must be received by the following schedule:

January 1 – May 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by June 15.

Presented at the ODS Summer Meeting.

May 16 - November 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by Dec. 15.

Presented at the ODS Annual General Meeting.

Please note: Your application must indicate an educational event that is after the award date.

Volunteer Hours: Volunteer hours counting towards ODS Education Scholarships include:

- Volunteering at ODS, its affiliated chapters and Region 9 sponsored shows, clinics, educational
 events, fundraisers, etc. Volunteer hours must be recorded and itemized on the ODS
 Education Scholarship Application Form. Validation of hours will be confirmed by the ODS
 Volunteer Coordinator from each event.
- 2. Write an article in the ODS newsletter.
- 3. Consideration will also be given for attendance at ODS, its affiliated chapters and Region 9 sponsored activities or functions. (ex: Summer Meeting, AGM or auditing the ODS Educational events).

Scholarship monies will not be awarded until after successful completion of attendance at the

approved dressage educational event with <u>validation of the attendance</u>; and, the <u>submission to ODS</u> of the required post report. An amount of \$200 will be awarded. Scholarship winners must write a post report article about their educational experience for which the scholarship was used and submit it to the ODS Scholarship Committee within 30 days of the event. This report / article will then be published in the newsletter.

The ODS Educational Scholarship is non-transferable and may only be used for the candidate's education. (ex. It may not be used for someone else riding your horse in a clinic.) Scholarships must be used within 1 year of the time it is awarded. No extensions will be granted.

The ODS Educational Scholarship Funds to administer the program should be held in a separate, interest-bearing account or with its own sub-account in ODS general funds. The ODS Educational Scholarship Fund must maintain a balance to fund this venture and a minimum of \$200 must remain in this account at all times. The funds generated by the silent auction at any AGM will be placed in the ODS Education Scholarship fund. Any sponsorship donations to this account will also be welcome.

Additional Information:

Scholarships may be applied for at any time of year by the corresponding deadline.

The ODS Educational Scholarship Committee will meet a minimum of two (2) times per year (June & December) to review all applications received up to that point and make the decisions about its awards. The ODS Educational Scholarship Committee may award zero (0) scholarships, or may award more than two (2) scholarships at each of these meetings as they deem fit. A maximum of four (4) Scholarships may be awarded each year. Not all allotted scholarships must be awarded in a single year. Determination of eligibility is at the sole discretion of the ODS Education Scholarship Committee.

An ODS member may only be awarded a scholarship once per twelve (12) months period. Once awarded a scholarship in a given twelve (12) months, a candidate may not apply again within that same twelve (12) months period. However, priority for subsequent years will be given to eligible candidates who have <u>not</u> received an education scholarship previously.

The ODS Education Scholarship Committee will include at least one (1) current ODS Board Member. The committee must consist of a total of three (3) to five (5) ODS members in good standing. The committee shall not exceed five (5) members.



Summer Barn Hack: Girth Sores Prevention, Solved!

Does your horse experience girth sores, especially during hot, sweaty summer months? Sometimes the shorter hair around the tender girth area can cause extra sensitive reactions to rubbing with the use of girths. This can result in open sores that are very hard to heal.

Here are two things to consider trying, either separately, or together.

- String girths The thin profile make it easy for the skin to work around the girth which minimizes rubs. There's no elastic in string dressage girths, so that might be a concern of its own, depending upon your horse. String dressage girths might take some sleuthing to find, however, they are available in synthetic white or black and the pricier option of mohair.
- 2. Body Glide stick You can find this on amazon.com, your local grocery store or discount retailer drug store. This is what many distance runners use on their own legs to reduce chaffing and it works on horses! Just apply the glide stick like deodorant in the area that usually causes issues, then saddle up as usual.


