### **Board Nominee- Michelle Beckes**

Greetings fellow equestrians!

2017 will be my 31<sup>st</sup> year as a member of the horseobsessed community. Without any end in sight, I would like to share my passion for life-long learning with the ODS community and our local Green Country Chapter.

My husband Scott and I have been together for 12 years, and while he may not understand my love for horses he has certainly learned to appreciate the hours of hard work it takes to become a good horseman/horsewoman. I earned my Masters of Library and Information Science degree from the University of Oklahoma in 2008. In December of 2012 I became the manager of my hometown branch at the Skiatook Library. It is a pleasure to serve the patrons of our homey little library, especially since it has been my go-to library since moving to Oklahoma in 1995. My education and experience as a librarian and manager has given me a skill set that I feel could be very useful as a board member. Twice I have had the opportunity to successfully chair the local arrangements committee of the Oklahoma Library Association's annual conference. It may not sound challenging, but

Trail riding in the mountains was an unforgettable experience, but I enjoyed showing most. A weekend trip to Hailey, Idaho for a H/J show at River Grove Farm, owned by Peggy and Parry Lewis (owners of Brentina) turned into a lifechanging experience. The show was great, but getting to meet Debbie McDonald was the highlight of that trip. She was still fairly new to dressage (as a fellow H/J convert), but her horses danced and amazed me! While others fawned over Bruce Willis and Demi Moore, I was fascinated by the dancing horses. Unfortunately Mr. Lewis passed away recently and River Grove Farm is now offered for sale, but I digress.

Another job transfer moved our family from Utah to Tulsa, Oklahoma in May of 1995. I started taking H/J lessons with Pie Lafferty and boy was she tough! My showing career didn't last long and I started to dabble in breed shows (APHA and Pinto), but going off to college created the largest gap in my dedication to riding full-time. After graduating with my masters I decided it was time to get serious again. I had been visiting local dressage shows just to get my "fix", but I never felt that I was a good enough rider for the "fancy dancing horses". Well, after meeting several GCC members in 2015, attending the Lee Tubman symposium, visiting with friends at GPC events, the ODS Spring I and II shows, GCDC, and dabbling in schooling shows, I feel very welcome. I hope that I am able to provide a skill set and willingness to volunteer that will be helpful to the dressage community of Oklahoma, ODS, and its chapters. I recently retired my APHA/PtHA gelding "Blue" to the status of trail riding partner and have started riding my coming 5 year old APHA/PtHA "Liam". #### **Board Nominee-Kay Kamish**

Dressage has always held the greatest attraction for me in how I wanted to relate to horses. In my growing up years as my father moved the family from one military station to another, I had the opportunity to try several styles of riding, but dressage was what always felt like where I wanted to be. The foundation of my education was laid while living in Connecticut as I had access to monthly clinics with Michael Handler, the son of the then director of the Spanish Riding School, and you can't get much closer to true 'classical' dressage than that! With that solid foundation, I always sought out instructors who followed those principles of correct gymnastic riding, putting the welfare of the horse always at the top. My own teaching and training philosophy reflects that foundation: the rider must first achieve their own balance and independence of seat before they can correctly influence the horse. If the rider is balanced and in self carriage, the horses will understand the aides and be able to perform with relaxation and confidence.

I moved to Oklahoma in 1976, and found there were only about four other people in the state who knew the word 'dressage'! And bless them, because they got it going here and nurtured it from the start. I am one of the Charter members of ODS, being at the meeting where Bee and Bob Pape guided us into the formation of ODS. A fulltime career as a Nurse, with 28 of those years flying for Tulsa Life Flight, along with having a small dressage training and instruction business, has kept me pretty busy up until now. I have recently stopped the nursing part of my career and am able to focus full time on teaching and training. With this new focus, I feel I can now offer my services to helping ODS as a Board member. I have served on the ODS Board in the past, during which time we brought the first USDF "L" Judges Program to the state. My principle interest is quality education made available to as many people who want to take advantage of it, and would like to work with the Board to see what more we can bring to our state. I have supported past educational events by offering to be a demo rider in many of them. I participated in the original USDF "L" Program, graduating with distinction. In my competition career my good horses have carried me to USDF Bronze and Silver Medals. I would look forward to sharing my experience by serving on the ODS Board.
