

**Breed Awards**: Ribbons from the breed organizations will also be awarded. Make sure you read all the criteria for these breed awards.





# 2015 New Dressage Tests Clinic & Symposium with Melissa Creswick

USEF 'S' Dressage Judge, 'r' Sporthorse Judge, USDF Gold Medalist

#### February 27 - March 1, 2015 Sponsored by the Oklahoma Dressage Society

Symposium Auditor Registration Closing Date: Postmarked by February 20, 2015

Late registration fee (postmarked after 2/20): \$5/day or \$10/for 3 days (be sure to text or e-mail Pamela if postmarked after 2/20)

<u>Clinic Schedule:</u> Friday, February 27 - Starting at 8:00 am and ending at 5:00 pm. Lunch at noon. Ten Rides to last 45 minutes each. Riders will be selected from the symposium demonstration riders.

<u>Symposium Schedule</u>: Saturday, February 28 and Sunday, March 1: 7:30 check-in, 9:00 lecture followed by watching demonstration riders complete the new national level tests, Training through 4<sup>th</sup> level. The first two tests of each level will be shown on Saturday and the highest test of each level will be shown on Sunday. Lectures and commentary will explain what changes have been made to the 2015 tests, describe how the levels relate to the training scale, and show how movements are scored along with tips to improve a score so that riders gain an understanding of how to ride a more effective test.
