No, not the pretty new saddle pad or that wonderfully balanced whip (like he would think THAT was a good idea). One of the very best things you can do for your horse is to become better educated about our sport of dressage. There are many reasons, but the best is that a more educated rider makes better training decisions.

So how do you become better educated? There are soooo many ways and opportunities. Without having to travel to Florida, you can experience international clinicians right here in our region!

Hilda Gurney is coming to Texas the weekend of November 2-3 for a two-day clinic aimed at educating the audience as much as the riders. This USDF Adult Education offering is in Weatherford, Texas, just west of Fort Worth. In additional to being an international level judge, Hilda Gurney's competition record is unsurpassed: an Olympic Team bronze medal in 1976; an individual gold and silver, and three team gold medals at the Pan Am Games; six USET National Grand Prix Championships on the legendary Hall of Fame member, Keen; 15 USDF Horse of the Year titles, and a team gold medal at the North American Dressage Championships. With more than 40 years as an instructor and trainer, she knows how to explain what you need to know at every level. Some of her students include riders such as Debbie McDonald, Charlotte Bredahl-Baker, and Kathleen Raine -- all of whom have competed in the Olympics. How about the Austin Dressage Clinic offering February 15-16, 2014? ADU is presenting their 5th Annual Judging Seminar with **Stephen Clarke** of Great Britain. Clarke will explain how horses should be judged at all levels. Clarke, the British judge who was President of the Ground Jury at the London 2012 Olympic Games, has been unanimously elected as the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) Dressage Judge General. Not a judge? It doesn't matter. You need to know what judges are looking for and why it's important. If you don't understand what makes the movements and qualities of the dressage horse correct, how are you going to know what to teach your horse? The 5th Annual ADU Judging Seminar will be held at Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas. More details will follow on the ADU web site at www.austindressageunlimited.org. Also, refer to future ODS newsletter publications for information on how you can benefit from this educational event.

We also have lots of opportunities within our own state. Each year, ODS provides an educational offering. This year, **Bill Solyntjes** will be giving a two-day clinic aimed at enlightening the audience called "How to Improve your Collective Marks". Solyntjes is a USDF "S" judge, "R" Sport Horse judge, a member of the USDF "L" faculty, and also chairs the test writing committee. Having trained several horses to Grand Prix, he understands the qualities necessary at each level. Additionally, he is a humorous, entertaining speaker.

There are a variety of clinicians who come to the state to teach, and auditing is always available, some free and some with a low fee. Watch your ODS Calendar at www.dressageoklahoma.org for constant updates. Also, we have approximately 20 ODS instructors who are available for lessons and will be happy to include auditors (check your ODS Directory).

Want to stay home, but still improve your understanding of dressage? Hit the internet. There are tons of articles. If you don't know where to start, go to www.usdf.org. Their e-TRAK program not only has articles on all sorts of topics, but even has mini-courses you can read through, take a very short test, and earn USDF University credits! Through your ODS membership, you are already receiving the USDF Connection magazine. Dressage Today is another magazine dedicated strictly to our sport. Countless books are available on the topic. If you are a beginner and don't know where to start, order the USDF Guide to Dressage. It not only gives you an overview of dressage, but also explains things from the very beginning: what equipment is used, what the arenas are like, what to expect during a lesson, what the movements are and how they're performed. It even provides a list of books -- from the old classics to more contemporary writings. There are also educational offerings that address rider fitness, rider's body use, sports psychology, and horse health.

With all these opportunities to become a better rider though increasing your education, how can you not do it? If not for yourself -- DO IT FOR YOUR HORSE!

The Thoughtful Rider Life Force Energy

Energy is so crucial in our daily lives. In addition to helping us make sense of the entire universe, the story of our lives revolves around how to harness and understand this energy and the relationship of how its philosophy and mechanics work. This living force or energy is the same for dressage horse and if harnessed there is unimaginable grace and power in the flow of energy. And within the different exercises it is that life force energy that is transformed from one form to another.

It is for this very reason that modern dressage, with its shortened necks and neck manipulations as a form of elasticizing the horse makes no sense and goes contrary to every principle known with the rest of life. Instead, it locks the poll and the horse is unable to turn its head left or right. It prevents the aids and impulsion to go through, creating stiffness in other parts of the body as well as numbness and tension in the mind.

The neck belongs to the horse in its entirety with a soft poll to allow for a swinging back and for the hind legs to step under the center of gravity. The idea is the harnessing of energy in the partnership with the horse and not of submissiveness and dominance. We need to get back to riding the horse from the hind legs, where the energy is found, to the front, where the energy is harnessed.

2013 Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame Inductees and 2013 USDF Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient Named

The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is pleased to announce that **Charles de Kunffy** and **Anne Gribbons** will be inducted into the **Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame** (HOF) at the Salute Gala and Annual Awards Banquet, on December 7, 2013, during the Adequan/USDF Annual Convention in Lexington, KY. Induction into the HOF is an honor bestowed on individuals and horses that have made outstanding contributions to dressage in the United States.

Charles de Kunffy has become known as a lifelong educator, prolific author, and charismatic instructor, and has had a resounding impact on dressage in America. For more than fifty years, he has dedicated his life to teaching classical dressage and sharing his passion for training and riding with horses and riders from all walks of life. His work as a national and international teacher, lecturer, and clinician has taken him throughout Europe, Africa, Australia, Canada, and the United States. Charles has published over seven books, including two autobiographies, as well as contributed his expertise to publications such as Dressage and Combined Training, The Chronicle of the Horse, Dressage Today, and USDF Connection. A retired FEI "C" (now 3*) and USEF "S" Judge, Charles has also served in various roles for several groups, including the Training of Teachers of Tomorrow Trust, USDF "L" Education Program, and International Dressage Judges Club. Of deKunffy, USDF President George Williams said, "Charles is one of the most eloquent ambassadors of dressage in our lifetime. There is no doubt his writing and teachings will continue to inspire many more generations of dressage enthusiasts to come."

Anne Gribbons has been a driving force in all facets of dressage in the United States. Her profound career has spanned over four decades and has made a considerable impact on the sport. During her time as an international rider, Anne represented the United States at the 1995 Pan American Games, in which the United States dressage team won the silver medal. She has also ridden and trained numerous horses to Grand Prix, including Kristall, Leonardo II, Tappan Zee, and Metallic, who was a member of the 1996 Olympic Bronze Medal Team. As an FEI 5* dressage judge, Anne has judged numerous CDIs, Olympic and Pan American trials, and FEI World Cup Finals. Anne's extensive involvement with USDF and USEF has resulted in the development of the American Dressage Pipeline, which was implemented during her tenure as USEF Dressage Technical Advisor and National Coach. She also served as a presenter for the 2010 USDF/USEF Young Rider Graduate Program and the 2011 Adequan/USDF National Symposium. In 2010, Anne was elected to serve as a member of the FEI Dressage Committee through 2013. Whether as a breeder, competitor, trainer, writer, or judge, Anne Gribbons has always been a strong advocate for dressage in the US. USDF President George Williams said, "Anne has never stood still . . . [she] has been a major force in the development of dressage in our country."

Marilyn Heath will be presented with the 2013 Lifetime Achievement Award at the Salute Gala & Annual Awards Banquet, on December 7, 2013, during the Adequan/USDF Annual Convention in Lexington, KY. Award winners are those who have shown a lifetime of dedication to USDF through volunteering, and developing programs, projects, and committees that have contributed to USDF's mission. They also have a long history of membership in USDF.

Marilyn Heath, of Naples, FL, has been a long and faithful volunteer to USDF through her dedication to judge education and involvement with USDF's "L" Education Program and the Delaware Valley Combined Training Association (DVCTA). After becoming a USEF "S" Judge in 1989, Marilyn could have worked towards becoming an FEI dressage judge. She chose, instead, to focus on judge education and became an "L" faculty member in 1992. As the co-chair and chair of the "L" Education Program, Marilyn exhibited strong leadership in updating the program and its materials, promoting consistency among other judge education programs, and providing accessibility to judge education to a wider audience. The DVCTA has also recognized her devotion to the sport, by creating the Marilyn O. Heath Judges Education Fund, in honor of her enthusiastic commitment to improving dressage judging education in America. Marilyn's passion for judging, personal integrity, and leadership have positively impacted USDF's judge education program, USDF's education mission, and the development of consistent and correct dressage education for all. USDF President George Williams said, "In her quiet unassuming way, Marilyn Heath oversaw the USDF "L" Program with a diligence and expertise that ensured it remained one of the best judges' training programs in the world."
