



A FOCUS FOR TRAINING: PREPARATION IS THE BASIS OF THE EXTENDED TROT

When your test calls for an extended

trot on the diagonal, you must prepare your horse on the short side. Try to engage your horse a little more by riding well through the corner with the inside leg firmly on the horse and the outside rein giving support and balance. After the corner, the horse should be straightened and a half halt should precede the first extended stride.

Once the horse executes the extension, you must move your hands a little forward to permit the neck to stretch and to give more freedom of the shoulder. Keep the rhythm in your hands. Watch that your horse does not fall on the forehand or start running. Give a half halt when crossing the center line to avoid these problems.



10 reasons to make a new year's resolution to become a better partner for your horse......Ridermanship[®] and learn how your Psoas, abdominals and gluts work together–or don't, for proper riding.

2. Be prepared to change. This course is about changing your "way of going." Stop being a pedestrian on a horse and begin to retrain your body to move in a different way! After all, if you do what you have always done, you will get what you always get.

3. You will learn that dressage is not a mystery. A half halt is just the reorganizing of your self-carriage. But do you know what rider self-carriage is?

4. Learn to self-carry like a dancer. You will develop your body to have the presence and grace of a dancer, or the elegance of an FEI rider.

5. You will learn exercises...but you will learn to do them in a way that will CHANGE your posture. Getting fit is ok, but it doesn't help change the way you carry your skeleton around. Doing exercise without being "through" is like doing shoulder in without being on the bit. It is just movement. Learning HOW to do the exercises while being through, on the bit, engaged in the haunches correctly is key to changing how you selfcarry.

6. Are you tired of your seat leaving the saddle and bouncing on your horse? Go watch a video of yourself– if you see space between your seat and the saddle, you are banging on your horse's back with every stride. Think about what that does to your horse. This course will give you the tools to change your riding position and biomechanics to stabilize your spine while being able to open and close your hips freely, much like a saloon door will swing open and close...only it will be your horse swinging through your hips. Only

then will your full seat breeches help you stay in the saddle :)

7. Frustrated your horse goes beautifully with your trainer, but you can't seem to get him to move that way? It's not because you are not capable. It is because you have never been taught how to use your body that invites the horse to move underneath you. Dressage trainers are not body experts-they are horse experts. Very few have the same expertise in how the human body works to be able to troubleshoot your physical issues.

8. You owe it to your horse. If my husband and I wanted to do ballroom dancing, and he took lessons to learn how, but I just showed up on the dance floor without any training...how fair is that? I would block his progress with my untrained movements.

9. You will do anything for your horse. Buy it a new saddle, get the best saddle pads, the best bridle. How much would you pay to make your horse comfortable?

10. It is the right thing to do. It is hard to face yourself. I know. As a dancer I faced myself every day in the studio in a leotard and tights. It is not easy to realize it's not your horse, but it's you. It is a brave rider who will look at themselves and commit to change.

IN FOCUS: CLINICIAN RAINEE BOYD

I started my career on horses as was the youngest member of a drill team at the age of 5, riding a polo pony that my dad had purchased. I rode every event that I could get to without a horse trailer. My sister was a trick rider! My parents took me to everyone that said that they were an instructor. Let me tell you where my legs were on the last one, they were almost to the middle of my horses shoulders. I will never forget that because when I met Neil Mannenbach at my first lesson my legs hurt so bad I could barely move them. Of course Neil, my first "Dressage" instructor, helped me get them back in place. I met Neil when I was 13 and I saw him on a horse called "Elegant Sam." Sam was a 17.2 hand Chestnut Anglo Arab with a blaze and 4 white stockings. They were so awesome to watch. That is when this girl decided that is what I want to do -- ride for the rest of my life. I started riding with Neil from then on. Of course when I moved to Oklahoma (from Illinois) no one rode "Dressage" or an "English Saddle" so I got asked a lot of questions about my saddle and why my horse was going sideways. I did a Dressage Exhibition at a rodeo and during my canter zig zags I heard a man in the crowd say loudly "that horse is drunk he can't even go in a straight line." My heart was broken that others didn't see Dressage as the beautiful sport that I saw it as. My horses that I have ridden have all been retired now, and due to health issues I am not competing much anymore but I absolutely love teaching! Back in "the day," when Neil suggested that I should teach, I nearly started that very day, eager to spread what I had learned from him! I absolutely love seeing a rider "get it" when they discover they can do it TOO! I call "Home", my 25acre geriatric horse ranch in Newkirk Ok.



The US Equestrian Athlete Lettering Program is open to equestrian athletes in all breeds or disciplines who are currently members of US Equestrian or become US Equestrian members. Students participating in the program need to record 100 hours of riding or training and three competitions of any level or type to complete the requirements for that year. Students may apply retroactively for previous years if they are still in grades 5-12 and can provide verification for each year. Seniors must submit all documentation by June 15 of their graduating year.

Oklahoma Dressage Society Education Scholarship

Information & Application

The ODS Educational Scholarship provides financial assistance to Oklahoma Dressage members to further their dressage education.

Criteria for eligibility:

- 1. This ODS Athlete Education Scholarship is open to all Oklahoma Dressage Society Members: juniors, adults, or vintage riders, amateurs or professionals, including ODS member volunteers and committee members.
- 2. Must be a current member in good standing of Oklahoma Dressage Society. In addition, applicant must have been an ODS member for at least 2 previous years. Current ODS Board Members are not eligible.
- 3. Must have a background of attending previous ODS dressage educational events. The more ODS event attendance, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Attendance at non ODS dressage educational events will be considered in addition.
- 4. Must have a background of volunteerism for ODS. This includes volunteering on at least 1 ODS committee or have accumulated 5 hours of volunteering at ODS events. The more ODS volunteerism, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Volunteerism for non ODS dressage related events will be considered in addition.

Criteria for using this ODS Scholar Athlete Education Scholarship:

Scholarship may be used toward the registration / entry fee for the following types of dressage educational events:

- 1. ODS educational events (ex. Judging Seminar, Workshops, Symposiums, Educational Practice Shows.)
- USDF sponsored educational programs (ex. USDF Adult or Junior Clinics, "L" Program, USDF Certified Instructor Program, USDF Convention or Symposium, USDF - University approved programs
- A educational event or clinic given by a USDF/USEF judge, USDF/USEF technical delegate, USDF Certified Instructor, USDF "L" Program graduate, USDF Gold or Silver Medalist. Clinics must be advertised and must be open to all ODS members. Standard lesson rates must be applied.
- 4. Scholarship winner must receive ODS Scholarship Committee pre-approval for the use of this scholarship at a specific dressage educational event, prior to the event occurring.

The ODS Scholarship Committee will review applications for funds and make recommendations to the Board for their vote. The Governing Board will select members to sit on this committee for a period of one year.

Application Deadline:

The ODS Educational Scholarship committee will meet twice a year. Each application must be received by the following schedule.

- January 1 May 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by June 15st and will be presented at the ODS Summer Meeting
- May 16 November 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by Dec. 15st at will be presented at the ODS AGM

<u>Please note</u>: Your application must indicate an educational event that is after the award date.

Volunteer Hours:

Volunteer hours counting towards Scholarships include:

- 1. ODS sponsored shows, clinics, educational events, fundraisers etc. Volunteer hours must be recorded and itemized on the ODS Scholarship Application Form. Validation of hours will be confirmed by the ODS Volunteer Co-Coordinator from each event.
- 2. Write an article in the ODS newsletter.

Consideration will also be given for attendance at an ODS activity or function. Examples being the Summer Meeting, AGM or auditing the ODS Educational event.

ODS Scholarship Funds:

Funds to administer the program should be held in a separate, interest-bearing account or with its own sub-account in our general funds financials. All silent auction proceeds from the ODS Annual General Meeting will be used to generate funds for this account. Any sponsorship donations to this account will also be welcome.

Scholarship monies will not be awarded until after successful completion of attendance at the approved dressage educational event with completed attendance and the submission to ODS of the required post report. An amount of \$150 or the amount to participate in the event, which-ever is less will be awarded.

Scholarship winner must write a post report article about their educational experience for which the scholarship was used and submit it to the ODS Scholarship Committee within 30 days of the event. This report / article will then be published in the newsletter.

The ODS Educational Scholarship is non-transferable and may only be used for the rider's education. (ex. It may not be used for someone else riding your horse in a clinic.)

Scholarship must be used within 1 year of the time it is awarded. No extensions will be granted.

1

Additional Information:

A maximum of four \$150 scholarships will be awarded by ODS to eligible applicants each year. The ODS Educational Scholarship Fund must maintain a balance to fund this venture and a minimum of \$150.00 must remain in this account at all times.

Scholarships may be applied for at any time of year. ODS Scholarship Committee will meet a minimum of 2 times a year (June & Dec) to review all applications received up to that point. The Educational Scholarship Committee may award "0" scholarships, or may award more than 1 scholarship at each of these meetings as they deem fit. A maximum 4 of Scholarships may be awarded each year.

Not all allotted scholarships may be awarded in a single year if Scholarship Committee does not deem enough applicants meeting minimum eligibility. Determination of eligibility is at the sole discretion of the ODS Scholarship Committee.

An ODS member may only be awarded a scholarship once per 12 month period. Once awarded a scholarship in a given year, applicant may apply again another year. However, priority for subsequent years will be given to eligible applicants who have not received a scholarship previously.

The ODS Education Scholarship Committee will include at least 1 current Board Member. The committee must have a total of 3 or 5 ODS members in good standing. The committee cannot exceed 5 people.


