The Dressage Foundation's Century Club recognizes dressage riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a test of any level at a show (schooling or recognized) or event, and are scored by a dressage judge or professional. Western Dressage riders are also welcome to join the Century Club. Visit: www.dressagefoundation.org, then click on the tab >Grants and Programs, >The Century Club >Join the Century Club. An application should be completed and sent to the Dressage Foundation at least two weeks prior to the ride. The Dressage Foundation (TDF) will send a beautiful black and gold ribbon to be presented to the team at the show. Following the ride, TDF sends a Century Club plaque to the new team.

The Century Club was formed at The Dressage Foundation in 1996, at the suggestion of Max Gahwyler (CT), who with his horse Prinz Eugen, became team # 2 in the Century Club (pictured at the left). The first "Centurion Class" ride, held in 1996, featured Lazelle Knocke and her teammate Don Perignon. Lazelle's ride came after her extensive 'three year vacation' away from riding due to surgery and rehab time. As she said, "Hopefully the Centurion class will be in the forefront of a very interesting opportunity for Seniors and Dressage as Recreational and Therapeutic riding. It really is challenging and has long-term goals and benefits."

The Century Club ride has evolved into a serious endeavor that encourages and rewards our older senior riders. The rider need not show everything at their level of ride, but it is important to show that rider and horse work well together. And while we stress the serious nature of riding a test, we want all senior riders for the Century Club to have fun! ★ Change fees waived for date, name, and location of competitions, including Championships Late insurance, late prize list, late competition recognition fees waived Competitor change of region fees through August 1 reduced from \$100 to \$25 and from August 2 to closing date reduced from \$300 to \$100 Competitors will be able to qualify by earning both scores at one competition; both scores may have the same judge or panel.

 \star During the entire 2020 qualifying season any qualifying score earned in a class that was designated Q, held prior to June 1, 2020, but not entered as Q, upon notice and payment of the \$15.00 qualifying fee to the USDF office prior to the closing of the date of the Championship, may be counted as a "good" qualifying score (membership requirements at the time of the competition where such score was obtained are unchanged).



NOTE: This scholarship info is pending discussion at the ODS summer meeting and membership approval.

The ODS Educational Scholarship provides financial assistance to Oklahoma Dressage members to further their dressage education.

Criteria for eligibility:

- 1. This ODS Athlete Education Scholarship is open to all Oklahoma Dressage Society Members: juniors, adults, or vintage riders, amateurs or professionals, including ODS member volunteers and committee members.
- 2. Must be a current member in good standing of Oklahoma Dressage Society. In addition, applicant must have been an ODS member for at least 2 previous years. Current ODS Board Members are not eligible.
- 3. Must have a background of attending previous ODS dressage educational events. The more ODS event attendance, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Attendance at non ODS dressage educational events will be considered in addition.
- 4. Must have a background of volunteerism for ODS. This includes volunteering on at least 1 ODS committee or have accumulated 5 hours of volunteering at ODS events. The more ODS volunteerism, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Volunteerism for non ODS dressage related events will be considered in addition.

Criteria for using this ODS Scholar Athlete Education Scholarship:

Scholarship may be used toward the registration / entry fee for the following types of dressage educational events:

- 1. ODS educational events (ex. Judging Seminar, Workshops, Symposiums, Educational Practice Shows.)
- 2. USDF sponsored educational programs (ex. USDF Adult or Junior Clinics, "L" Program, USDF Certified Instructor Program, USDF Convention or Symposium, USDF University approved programs
- A educational event or clinic given by a USDF/USEF judge, USDF/USEF technical delegate, USDF Certified Instructor, USDF "L" Program graduate, USDF Gold or Silver Medalist. Clinics must be advertised and must be open to all ODS members. Standard lesson rates must be applied.
- 4. Scholarship winner must receive ODS Scholarship Committee pre-approval for the use of this scholarship at a specific dressage educational event, prior to the event occurring.

The ODS Scholarship Committee will review applications for funds and make recommendations to the Board for their vote. The Governing Board will select members to sit on this committee <u>for a period of one year</u>.

Application Deadline:

The ODS Educational Scholarship committee will meet twice a year. Each application must be received by the following schedule.

January 1 – May 15Scholarship(s) to be awarded by June 15st and will be presented at the ODS Summer MeetingMay 16 - November 15Scholarship(s) to be awarded by Dec. 15st at will be presented at the ODS AGM

<u>Please note</u>: Your application must indicate an educational event that is after the award date.

Volunteer Hours:

Volunteer hours counting towards Scholarships include:

- 1. ODS sponsored shows, clinics, educational events, fundraisers etc. Volunteer hours must be recorded and itemized on the ODS Scholarship Application Form. Validation of hours will be confirmed by the ODS Volunteer Co-Coordinator from each event.
- 2. Write an article in the ODS newsletter.

Consideration will also be given for attendance at an ODS activity or function. Examples being the Summer Meeting, AGM or auditing the ODS Educational event.

ODS Scholarship Funds:

Funds to administer the program should be held in a separate, interest-bearing account or with its own sub-account in our general funds financials.

All silent auction proceeds from the ODS Annual General Meeting will be used to generate funds for this account. Any sponsorship donations to this account will also be welcome.

Scholarship monies will not be awarded until after successful completion of attendance at the approved dressage educational event with completed attendance and the submission to ODS of the required post report. An amount of \$200 or the amount to participate in the event, which-ever is less will be awarded.

Scholarship winner must write a post report article about their educational experience for which the scholarship was used and submit it to the ODS Scholarship Committee within 30 days of the event. This report / article will then be published in the newsletter.

The ODS Educational Scholarship is non-transferable and may only be used for the rider's education. (ex. It may not be used for someone else riding your horse in a clinic.)

Scholarship must be used within 1 year of the time it is awarded. No extensions will be granted.

Additional Information:

A maximum of four \$200 scholarships will be awarded by ODS to eligible applicants each year. The ODS Educational Scholarship Fund must maintain a balance to fund this venture and a minimum of \$200 must remain in this account at all times.

Scholarships may be applied for at any time of year. ODS Scholarship Committee will meet a minimum of 2 times a year (June & Dec) to review all applications received up to that point. The Educational Scholarship Committee may award "0" scholarships, or may award more than 1 scholarship at each of these meetings as they deem fit. A maximum of four Scholarships may be awarded each year.

Not all allotted scholarships must be awarded in a single year if Scholarship Committee does not deem enough applicants meeting minimum eligibility. Determination of eligibility is at the sole discretion of the ODS Scholarship Committee.

An ODS member may only be awarded a scholarship once per 12 month period. Once awarded a scholarship in a given year, applicant may apply again another year. However, priority for subsequent years will be given to eligible applicants who have not received a scholarship previously.

The ODS Education Scholarship Committee will include at least 1 current Board Member. The committee must have a total of 3 or 5 ODS members in good standing. The committee cannot exceed 5 people.





Sandra Edmondson On Equine Sports Massage

Have you ever really wondered about how massage works on the body — your horse's body? Much like we smaller-scaled humans, larger animals like horses also benefit from massage. They have a lot more bodily real estate than we do, so the benefits are big! Just what <u>is</u> massage for our equine friends? To help us all understand a little better, here's a brief overview written just for <u>Centerline</u> by certified equine sports massage therapist, Sandra Edmondson. Many ODS fondly remember Sandra from the June Zoom meeting - what a treat to have her educate us!

The benefits of Equine Sports Massage Therapy include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Decreased Pain
- 2. Improved Range of Motion and Flexibility
- 3. Immune Support
- 4. Decreased Stress/Improved Mood
- 5. Improved Posture, Circulation, and Muscle Tone
- 6. Injury Prevention

A few of the common techniques used in massage therapy are **Effleurage**, **Petrissage**, **Tapotement**, and **Trigger Point Therapy**.

Effleurage is a series of massage therapy strokes used to "warm up" a muscle before any deep tissue work is to begin on the body. Effleurage increases circulation by increasing the temperature of muscles and preparing them for more vigorous massage therapy techniques. Effleurage also stimulates the

Lymphatic System, ridding the body of "toxins" or metabolic waste that has accumulated in the muscles over time.

Petrissage is a massage therapy technique that may include kneading, stretching, and squeezing soft tissues and underlying muscles to release adhesions or restrictions in the body. Adhesions are areas of thick connective tissue that develop after a muscular injury or even surgery. Petrissage can improve blood circulation and relax the muscles to increase flexibility and range of motion.

Tapotement is a specific massage therapy technique of rhythmic percussion. Tapotement is most frequently administered by the edge of the hand, tips of the fingers, or a cupped hand. This technique is typically used to "wake up" the Nervous System and is also considered a stimulating stroke which can release lymphatic build up in the region of the back.

Trigger Point Therapy is used to release painful muscle spasms or trigger points in the body. Trigger points are painful, tense areas found in the muscles. They are one of the most common causes for chronic musculoskeletal pain, also known as myofascial pain. Once the trigger point or spasm has decreased, improved blood circulation occurs and the surrounding fascia is released.

Take Good Care In Outdoor Summertime Activity: Heat Exhaustion

Heat exhaustion is one of the heat-related syndromes. Symptoms range in severity from mild heat cramps to heat exhaustion to potentially life-threatening heatstroke. Heat exhaustion can begin suddenly or over time, usually after working or playing in the heat, perspiring

heavily, or being dehydrated.

Heat exhaustion signs and symptoms include:

- Cool, moist skin with goose bumps when in the heat
- Heavy sweating
- Faintness
- Dizziness
- Fatigue
- Weak, rapid pulse
- Low blood pressure upon standing
- Muscle cramps
- Nausea
- Headache



If you suspect heat exhaustion

Untreated, heat exhaustion can lead to heatstroke, which is a life-threatening condition. If you suspect heat exhaustion, take these steps immediately:

- Move the person out of the heat and into a shady or air-conditioned place.
- Lay the person down and elevate the legs and feet slightly.
- Remove tight or heavy clothing.
- Have the person drink cool water or other nonalcoholic beverage without caffeine.
- Cool the person by spraying or sponging with cool water and fanning.
- Monitor the person carefully.

Contact a doctor if signs or symptoms worsen or if they don't improve within one hour.

Call 911 or your local emergency number if the person's condition deteriorates, especially if he or she experiences:

- Fainting
- Agitation
- Confusion
- Seizures
- Inability to drink
- Core body temperature measured by rectal thermometer of 104 F (40 C) (heatstroke)




